COMMUNITY POLICING ...



With the New Year now upon us and the possibility of cold weather coming, bear in mind the likelihood of ice on the roads.

Due to the many issues last year, regarding the amount of grit available to local villages, the local authorities now have suitable amounts to deal with the public roads. It is vital to note that this grit is for use on the roads and that to take this grit from the bins for personal use is theft. We are strongly advising that if you need grit, that you attend a local builders or agricultural merchants and buy a bag, which can be obtained for between £5 to £7. The local authorities have indicated they may prosecute "grit thieves". Please think of vulnerable neighbours and consider gritting their driveways for them.

Many people will be topping up their oil tanks. Dorset Police strongly advise that you protect your tanks. Your local safer neighbourhood team can advise you about the Stop That Oil scheme, which aims to prevent oil theft.

Remember to report any suspicious activity/incidents on the new non-emergency number 101. Happy new year from the Beaminster team.

LETTER FROM THOMAS TAKEZOE...

Dear Contributors,

First of all I would like to thank everyone once again for the help and support you gave me in raising the £4700 that I needed in order to come out to Valparaiso in Chile to teach English for the organisation Project Trust. It has now been four months since I left Britain and I'd like to tell everyone what I've been up to.

When I left England on the 19th of August it didn't seem like I was going away for a long time. It felt like a normal holiday. Even when I arrived in Santiago after twenty hours of flights nothing seemed quite real. I just felt like a tourist, staying in a hostel and going out a for a meal. It was only when I arrived in Valparaiso and was introduced to my host family that I really felt I was going to be here for a year. Valparaiso is a very bohemian place. There are lots of artists, craftsmen and musicians here. There are many arts and music festivals throughout the year. There is always something going on - you just have find it. Valparaiso is a port town surrounded by 42 inhabited hills, each quite unique since they were initially inhabited by different communities of immigrants (Spanish, Germans, Italians and British). It is very interesting just to wander up and down them, although the majority are very steep.

The Chilean people are very welcoming and I felt at home right away. The family I live with is quite large: seven, not including me and my companion who is also with Project trust. There are always countless people coming in and out of the house, both family and friends. Chilean culture is very much centred around the family and we are treated like two extra sons.

When we first arrived here we were given two weeks to settle in before we even met the school children! Chileans are very relaxed about work and often put things off saving "manana, manana". Our school is a partially state funded and partially private school (from reception to year 8, 14 year olds). There are three types of school in Chile: state, partial and prívate. The state education isn't very good at all and everyone wants the partial schools to become free state schools, which is the reason for the protests in Chile at the moment. All the state schools are on walkouts so their students haven't been to school for at least 5 months! Our school isn't that politically active as the children are so young but the teachers all oppose the current education system. There are protests by university and secondary students at least once a week in Valpo, since the national congress is here, always ending in clashes with the police who use teargas and water cannons regularly. Our first classes were with year 7s and 8s, which were interesting to say the least! My partner and I have a small room in the school where one of us takes half of the class whilst the other one stays in the classroom and teaches English there. All classes have 40 students and we take 20 each, so the going was tough straight away. Chilean children love to chat and when there's 20, it's hard to get anything done. Having only just left school myself, I found it quite difficult to discipline them and relate to the role of a teacher. I have since got used to them and their ways just as they have got used to me and now the classes go a lot more smoothly. We gradually took on more classes and now we teach every year and class including kindergarten.

With the younger children we take the whole class together, my partner and I and another teacher just to supervise. I find the younger children a lot easier to teach because less disciplining is required and they are a lot more enthusiastic. They are very sweet and all call us tio (uncle). We take English workshops after school with each year apart from the really young ones, which is usually a class of ten or less. These are much more informal and the children really want to learn. Once a week we also teach English in a Jogar de Cristo (home of christ) for the elderly and abused girls with nowhere else to go. We teach only the girls that want to learn, which is usually 4 of them out of the 15 who live there. They girls range from age 12 to 20 and they live in a very peaceful and spacious compound. Now we have got used to it here, we are thinking about starting an art club and a ceilidh dance club after school for the children.

Thank you all again and I hope you enjoyed reading this brief background to my project. Thomas Takezoe

WELDMAR HOSPICE CHIDEOCK


Calling all jazz followers.

CREEDS...

Fifty years ago a Beaminster bookseller was looking for a printer. Mrs Forbes of the Eype's Mouth Hotel recommended John Creed of Broadoak. And in due course the bookseller – the late James Stevens Cox (1910-1997) - had a pamphlet printed by Mr Creed. It was the beginning of a long and happy relationship. Over the last half century Creeds have printed hundreds of titles for Cox's Toucan Press. The first pamphlet was just four pages long – 'Places of interest to visit in and around Eype'. One of the latest titles is 'The Guernsey Merchants and their world in the Georgian era',



a book written by James' son Gregory, and running to nearly 300 pages.

Many of the titles printed by Creeds and published by the Toucan Press have been about Thomas Hardy. There was a series of 72 monographs on the life, times and works of Thomas Hardy, printed in the 1960s. In 1970 the Toucan Press founded 'The Thomas Hardy Yearbook' and it is now entering its fifth decade. It is an academic journal and copies are distributed to leading university libraries throughout Europe and North America. Every issue has been printed by Creeds. John Creed, founder of Creeds the Printers, is, coincidentally, related to the Hardy family. His great-grandmother was Matilda Hardy of Puddletown.

John Creed, Audrey Creed, Andrew 'Harry' Harrison, Marilyn Harrison and Gregory Stevens Cox celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Cox – Creed relationship on Wednesday evening at 'The Ilchester Arms' in Symondsbury. They enjoyed a very Dorset menu.
