# Refuse And Kerbside Recycling Collection Arrangements For Christmas And New Year.

#### NORMAL DAY REARRANGED DAY

Normal collections resume on Monday 14th January 2013

#### Vegetation Overhanging Footways, Carriageway or Verges.

It is the responsibility of the owner or occupier of any land or property to ensure that the frontage hedge or other vegetation growing on their land does not impede passage along the highway, which includes the carriageway, footpath and verge. Hedges should be cut back to the boundary or vertically above the rear of the footpath for a clear height of 2.2 metres.

Trees should be cut back to at least 500mm behind the kerb line to a clear height of 5.2 metres above the carriageway on minor roads and 6.6 metres on main roads.

The county council is responsible only for trees and hedges on land that has been officially adopted or purchased for highway improvements.

#### Obscured Road Signs.

Again, it is the responsibility of the owner or occupier of land or property to ensure that vegetation growing on their land does not obscure any road traffic sign.

#### The Village Car Park.

A reminder that Foss Orchard Car Park was given to the Parish Council on behalf of the village and is maintained by the Parish Council. Whilst 3 spaces in the car park are signed for users of the Village Shop for short term (20 min) parking, it is not the Londis Car Park.

#### Water Leaks.

If you see a water or sewage leak, report it straight away – don't assume that someone else has. Wessex Water would rather be told several times than not at all. Water is a valuable resource and we can't afford to waste it through leaks.

You can report a leak to Wessex Water at any time on 0800 692 0 692.

If the leak appears to be serious they come out very promptly to assess and repair it.

Did you know that Wessex Water will repair most domestic leaks even on private land? But they don't go any further than where the pipe enters the property – that has to be dealt with by your own plumber.

# "Clacking" manhole cover? Pothole? Subsidence? Damaged sign? Blocked road drain?

Problems with the carriageway, footways and signs on the A35 trunk road are Connect's responsibility – either ring them on 01404 823381 or contact the Parish Clerk.

All other public roads are DCC Highways' responsibility – contact them on 01305 221020 (24 hr service) or via Dorset Direct on 01305 221000 or contact the Parish Clerk.

#### Street light on during the day? Not on at night? Damaged post or lamp?

Problems with lights on the A35 should be reported to Connect, as above.

DCC are responsible for all street lights on all other public roads. Report faulty street lights on 0800 068 4145 – they need the light's number, which you will find on the post. Or you can report it online – there is an interactive map where you can locate the light in question and report the fault – see www.lightsonindorset.co.uk/Public/ReportFault.aspx

#### **Dog Fouling.**

Dog fouling is unpleasant and can be a health hazard. If you do not clean up any faeces left in a public area by a dog you are in charge of you will be committing an offence. It is particularly unpleasant and hazardous to children on Clapps Mead, the village's playing field.

If you wish to complain about dog fouling in a particular area, please contact WDDC Environmental Health on 01305 252289. A dog warden may then contact you and/or visit the area to assess how severe the problem is. They will then take the appropriate action to deal with the problem. If it is not possible to take any action, WDDC will tell you why. Alternatively, inform the Parish Clerk, giving as much information as possible.

#### CHIDEOCK SOCIETY

Our October A.G.M. was very well attended by members and also by visitors from far afield who had come to hear guest speaker Graham Harvey . He gave a fascinating and informative talk on the importance of mixed farming and going back to feeding livestock on grass and not corn. In the discussion afterwards several members of the audience revealed their expertise in a wide range of issues linking food with health. (Kate Geraghty apologised for serving junk food for refreshments) He also answered questions about writing for the 'The Archers' and was asked if the storylines were Art reflecting Life or vice versa. The audience asked if certain issues could be covered in the BBC serial like teaching children to cook and stopping garden pesticides killing bees. He explained that writers have to be scrupulously fair about giving equal time to both sides of an issue. A large pile of his books sold out in minutes.

Members also heard about plans for the Woodland Trust Tree project which will be taking place in November. Our application was successful and we will be receiving 420 free trees to plant in the parish, including the Jubilee Oak tree. We are delighted to announce that thanks to Mrs Muriel Chattin and family we have already agreed and marked the site for the oak and two small groups of trees near to Footpath 17. Dates to be confirmed Sat 17th and Sat 24th November. We are awaiting news from the National Trust for the date to plant the boundary hedge at East Cliff, Seatown. The committee thanked all those who had helped in the past year and especially two members who are standing down. Jean Jones the membership secretary and Nicky Zaiger who has kept the catering up to standard and we welcomed three new members who have offered to take on specific tasks to help.

Prints and postcards of the illustrations on the history board were on sale for the first time and much admired. They make a lovely Christmas qift.
