# Notification that Chideock is at risk of flash flooding...

The Environment Agency is working with Chideock's Flood Group, to help Chideock's community become resilient to the risk of flash flooding The Environment Agency have recently undertaken a study to identify areas at risk of flash flooding. The study confirmed that Chideock is a location that may be at risk from this type of flooding.



Flash flooding is caused by intense rainfall. It occurs suddenly, with little or no warning – often before emergency services arrive. Flash flooding can be very destructive: flooding homes, moving rocks, tearing out trees, sweeping away vehicles and damaging buildings, walls and bridges. Flash flooding can also happen where drainage systems are unable to cope with extreme rainfall.

We are working together to mitigate the impacts of a flash flood for Chideock. Key to this is awareness raising within the community as well the development of Chideock's Community Flood Resilience Plan.

There are lots of things you can also do to prepare for flooding, to minimise the risk to yourself and your property e.g. moving valuables and family mementos upstairs, moving cars to higher ground, or businesses moving stock and equipment to protect it from floodwater.

You could also prepare a flood kit or a personal flood plan in advance, to keep on standby.

#### Flood Kit:

- Important documents such as passport and insurance certificates. Some documents are expensive to replace. Having these in your kit will keep them safe and to hand.
- Torch in case it floods at night and your power is affected.
- Radio a wind-up or battery radio will help you monitor local news and weather broadcasts for the latest flooding situation.
- Batteries have spare batteries available to power your torch or radio.
- Blankets or warm clothing it may be cold and you could be without power for some time.
- First aid kit keep a first aid kit to hand in case of minor injuries. Put any prescription
  medication in your kit so that you have easy access to it.
- Bottled water flood water can contain sewage, chemicals and animal waste. Drinking bottle water will keep you hydrated and make sure your water hasn't been contaminated by the flood water.
- Tinned food you don't know how long the flood will last. Have tinned and nonperishable food available for you to eat.
- Personal items some items are irreplaceable. Put items of personal value such as
  photos, family videos or treasured mementos in your flood kit so that they are safe.
- Mobile phone keep a fully charged mobile with you so that you can contact people in an emergency or call for help. If your phone has Internet access you can use it to check on the latest flood situation.
- Waterproof clothing keep wellies and rubber gloves available should you need to enter the flood water

# VISIT BY OUR NEW FRENCH FRIENDS FROM GAILLON IN NORMANDY: MAY $3^{RD} - 6^{TH}$ .

The visit by our twinned parishes in the Evreux Diocese of northern France is still going ahead! A small planning group are now at work to sort out the arrangements and Programme.

Our hope is they arrive for Friday 3<sup>rd</sup>, and leave on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> May. We expect them to come by car on the Poole or Portsmouth Ferries.

There will be 3 couples coming along with their Parish Priest, Nicholas. So we will be looking for offers of bed and breakfast accommodation for 3 nights. We hope that they will have opportunity for one or two evening meals in people's homes to relate more closely. Most are quite good English speakers, so no worries on that score! We aim to give them a busy Sunday, including: Morning Visits to Whitchurch Church Cafe, and to a special Village Service at Chideock. We could give them lunch at a local pub, followed by some good discussion with the local Roman Catholics on ecumenical cooperation. #### SUPERFAST BROADBAND in chideock

Chideock will benefit from the Superfast Dorset project to invest £19 million public funds to ensure rural areas do not get left behind in the race for faster and more reliable broadband.

Commercial providers will install access to Dorset's larger towns but big rural areas including much of West Dorset would be left behind without Superfast Dorset. The project aims to ensure 95% of Dorset's premises have access to superfast speeds of at least 24Mbps.

Any premises which do not get superfast broadband will get access to at least 2Mbps, which will be a considerable improvement for many. Currently one in five premises across Dorset get just 0.5Mbps. A map is available on www.dorsetforyou.com/superfast showing where the commercial rollout will happen and where Superfast Dorset will be improving access.

Superfast Dorset went out to tender in February to find a provider to install the infrastructure. Once appointed in the summer, detailed planning will begin on the rollout plan.

Over 7,000 people have already registered their interest in superfast broadband through an online survey at www.dorsetforyou.com/superfast. The survey collects information about people's broadband needs which will help with the detailed planning. If you haven't already expressed an interest, please do let us know what broadband requirements you have.

The Parish Council is pleased to welcome Cllr. Roger Carey, who was co-opted on to the Council at the meeting on 26 February.

#### <u>Annual Village Meeting – 7:00for 7:30 pm Tuesday 23 April, at the Village Hall.</u>

Refreshments, courtesy of the Chideock Society, will be available from 7:00pm with the meeting starting at 7:30pm.

The Parish Council will report on what has been done over the past year. WDDC Cllr Summers, DCC Cllr Brierley and the Police will be invited to attend and speak about their work. Representatives of Village groups are invited to give a short summary of their activities. There will be an "open session" for residents to raise matters which they think the Parish Council should take on board. If any matter is called to a vote then only people on the electoral role are eligible to vote. This meeting has, by law, to be hosted by the Parish Council and must take place between 1 April and 1 June. The Chair of the Annual Village Meeting must be taken by the Chair of the Parish Council, if present, otherwise by the Vice Chair of the Parish Council. If neither is present then the Village Meeting must appoint someone to take the chair. The Clerk to the Parish Council takes the minutes. The Annual Village Meeting is NOT a Parish Council meeting.

However, Mr Cox of WDLH has written to the Parish Council to inform them that he is no longer able to continue with the grass cutting. The Parish Council is now looking for a new contractor to take over this responsibility.
