SO WE SHOULDN'T BE SURPRISED

There was a time when our politicians would consult The Church before making major decision because they valued biblical guidance ... so we shouldn't be surprised that U-Turns are becoming more common. There was a time when going to Church was a whole family activity with everyone going to the weekly prayer meeting, the Bible Study and reaching out with local evangelism... so we shouldn't be surprised that many people including today's youngsters describe Church as dull and boring. What we are trying to do in writing these magazine articles is to 'whet' your appetite to see that Christianity offers the best way forward. Before I became a Christian by meeting the repentance challenge, I had wanted to believe that my good works and generosity had pleased God but I was wrong. Nor had I been able to answer those two questions: What is the meaning of life? ... and ... What am I doing here? As I look back over 30 years of Christian Ministry I can say that it has been very rewarding yet no without its challenges ... but it has never been dull and boring. There was a time when no English denomination would ever have chosen to depart from the worship and teaching principles of the Early Church described in the Gospels ... So we shouldn't be surprised by shrinking congregations.

I take comfort from the words of that hymn: 'My hope I cannot measure, My path to life is free; My Saviour is my treasure, And He will walk with me.'

Things are different on the Scottish Island of Lewis, where we lived before, because everyone accepts that the Christian journey can only ever start with a statement of personal repentance. Here one finds a tangible hunger for the things of God and the Churches are full and often overflowing Sunday mornings and evenings. The weekly prayer meetings and Bible Studies are well attended by the majority and no embarrassment if expressed in talking about the day of judgment, sin or the reality of heaven, etc... so we shouldn't **be** surprised that God has visited Lewis with revival.

I have lost count of the number of sincere well-meaning people including church-goers to whom we have ministered over the years, who have been dismayed that their 'sorry prayers' had failed to get God's attention. Jesus teaching requires us to repent, which is a bold confession of sin and anceptance of an intention to change to doing things His Way. Saying sorry may appear to neatly sidestep Jesus repentance teaching but 'sorry' can only ever be an expression of regret.

There is a scripture in Acts 3 v19 which precisely relates to this article: 'Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord.' May I recommend an easily read booklet by Ed Roebert 'Explaining Repentance' ISBN I-85240-067-6 printed by Sovereign World. Many of us belong to various clubs and societies, most of whom have a registered code of conduct for membership ... s we shouldn't be **surprised** that God has given us this scripture in Acts 3 as His entry requirements for Christian Membership.

Anyone who recognises their need to respond to this scripture should visit a Christian Minister or your might like to come to one of our Thursday afternoon meetings at Honeysuckle Cottage at 2.30pm (Wednesdays for Bible Reading – 2.30pm).

Casual Vacancy on the Parish Council.

Elizabeth Grant has stood down from the Parish Council after 5 years, having been Chair for the last 2 years. She is continuing as a member of the Playing Field Management Group and will still be selling Footpath Guides to the outlets. The Parish Council thanks her for all her work for the community over the past 5 years.

As it seems unlikely that 10 electors will request an election (deadline 21 June), the Parish Council will be looking to co-opt to fill the vacancy.

A35 Public Meeting with Oliver Letwin MP and Highways England Representatives.

Following the Public Meeting on Friday 27 May 2016, Chideock Parish Council is agreed that its policy and priorities are to press Oliver Letwin MP and Highways England for

- 1. A Low Emission Zone in the village
- 2. A Safety Audit to identify measures to improve health and safety in the village by dealing with traffic and traffic impacts on property and people.

At the meeting the majority of questions and comments from the public were in regard to emissions and air pollution, HGV numbers, vehicle speed, vibration, noise, lack of footpath, dangers / difficulties in crossing the A35, the possibility of a "low emission zone", a bypass, redirection of traffic away from the A35, and "surfing" between speed cameras.

Oliver Letwin asked for a show of hands for people wanting safety improvements, which could be delivered more quickly and at far less cost than a bypass. He said he would back this is there is a consensus as to what safety improvements are needed.

He then asked for a show of hands for those wanting a bypass, but said that whilst there may be consensus that a bypass is needed, there may not be consensus as to the route it should take. He said he would back this if a consensus on the route was reached. He is also willing to back the introduction of a "low emissions zone".

Playing Field Management Group.

The Parish Council is looking for a new Church of England representative on the Playing Field Management Group.

When the Grafton family gave the land to the Parish Council in 1938, to manage on behalf of the village, one of the conditions was that there must be a Management Group which must have at least one representative from the Church of England, the Roman Catholic Church and the Parish Council.

The Management Group decides what needs to be done to maintain the area, including the Children's Play Area. Members do not necessarily take part in working parties etc.

<u>Public & Schools Bus Services Review - Have your say on the future of transport in</u> Dorset

From Dorset County Council.

"Dorset County Council is seeking people's views on our proposals for the future of subsidised bus services in Dorset. The council needs to save £1.85 million from supported transport. Savings have already been made. Earlier this year we carried out the Rural Bus Services Review and the result of this was that in April 2016 the public transport subsidy was reduced by around £500,000. We must now reduce the public transport subsidy by another £1m and we must also reduce the cost of school transport services by £850,000. These savings must be in place by 2017/18. It will not be possible to retain the current public bus network within our revised budgets. Many existing services will change.

- We propose to prioritise remaining subsidy on those core routes that are
 able to serve the most people and contribute the most to the economic
 wellbeing of the county. Core routes are the regular interurban services
 that link Dorset's towns and serve around 80% of Dorset's population.
- We propose to open many more school services for use by the public, ensuring rural residents can access Dorset's market towns.
- We propose to work closely with community transport operators, community groups and councillors to develop Dorset's community transport network.
- We propose to work closely with operators to attempt to secure rural 'infill' routes. In-fill routes are rural services that operate between school opening and closing times, making use of empty vehicles travelling to and from schools services.

Dorset County Council is consulting a wide range of people about the proposals above. We are keen to find out your views on our proposals and how these changes could affect you.

The results of this consultation will help us to decide how to proceed with the review and help to form the future shape of Dorset's transport network.

The consultation runs for eight weeks ending on the 22nd July. The results of the consultation, the Cabinet decision and any implementation information will be published on the review's web-page. The outcome of this review will be implemented in Summer 2017."

Seatown Regeneration Project

As many will know, following an extensive consultation process, the independent consultant team has provided its final report. The Chideock Society, which commissioned the report, and The Parish Council have considered this in detail and have welcomed the professional approach of the team. The consultants have worked hard to understand the complex needs for Seatown and , as those who have read the report (available online at the Chideock and Seatown website) will know, the team proposed a series of recommendations.

The Chideock Society considered these and identified the securing of the damaged slipway/concrete apron and the highly-at-risk end of the roadway as the very highest of priorities, and the Parish Council has further endorsed this approach. There has been support for the report and its recommendations from other organisations which were consulted and included in the discussions, as part of the process.

Further to this, a meeting has been arranged with representatives from the County and District Councils to, hopefully, find a way forward in which the resources of these organisations can be used to take these actions further, and to prepare for a bid to central government funds for this urgently needed work, notably the recently announced 'Coastal Communities Fund'. As more information becomes available you can be sure that we will let you know of progress.


