GOOD HOLIDAYS!

I am writing this Article just before the Easter weekend – and of course in May we have two more Bank Holidays and the half term holiday. This leads me to reflect upon the purpose and value of holidays, for ourselves and others. Living in a prime holiday area, we are only too aware of the effect of holidaymakers upon our lives – above all upon journey times along the A35! For some people, public holidays are a nuisance because of all the hassle that tourists can cause. But for others, visitors enable them to earn a living in all the tourist related industries. Our churches benefit from holidaymakers, with increased numbers attending Sunday Services (although we have fewer attending than even 5 or 10 years ago). Also, we enjoy visitors attending a large variety of fund raising events such as Concerts and Cream Teas! Our Visitors Books record many visitors who come to admire the beautiful architecture of our buildings and the spiritual peace within.

What is the purpose of holidays? The word derives from the old English: 'Holyday'. In days when the churches were far more influential, there were many different religious holidays which revolved around Saints Days and other special religious festivals such as the Ascension, Transfiguration, Whitsun, and Marian Festivals. Their purpose was to set aside days for prayer, reflection and celebration of the lives of holy men and women. Only a tiny proportion of the population see things in those terms today! For most people holidays are essentially opportunities for pleasure and relaxation. But given the huge amount of stress involved in travelling and the high costs incurred on most holidays, I do wonder just how 'good for the soul' they are for many!

One of my purposes in life and ministry here is to serve our many visitors, to help them to gain maximum enjoyment of their holidays! I try not to see them mainly as a source of additional income! One of my favourite ways of doing this is by helping lead fossil hunting walks at the Charmouth Heritage Coast Centre. I was involved in one today with over 100 people! By talking to these holidaymakers one can form a transient but nevertheless real relationship with them. This can enrich their holiday experience through personal interaction. Of course, I gain from their friendship as well as hopefully they gain from mine! The same is true in our churches – in one of our churches the sidespeople make a point of finding out where visitors come from, and then welcome them accordingly within the Service. We've formed long standing friendships with some of these visitors, who want to return again to such a friendly place!

So, I encourage the notion of enabling holidaymakers to enjoy their holiday experience here, in a truly Christian manner. And it is also good when we are on holiday elsewhere to 'bless' the people who serve us in hotels, transport, restaurants and shops through our courtesy and respect of their customs but also by engaging in meaningful friendship towards them at every opportunity. Thus it might just be that we and they can recapture a fuller sense of the 'holy' potential of holidays!



Friends Against Scams

Would you, your family, your community, or workplace like to understand more about scams and why people can become scam victims?

More than £5 billion is lost to scams in the UK each year. People who are scammed will lose money and may also suffer a loss of independence, of good health and of wellbeing. Many people do not report being a victim, but silence is a scammer's best friend. Championed in Dorset by Dorset County Council Trading Standards Service, 'Friends Against Scams' is a national initiative that aims to

A35 Matters.

The following resolutions were passed unanimously at the Parish Council meeting on 28 March 2017.

- 1. Chideock Parish Council will not take a position for or against proposals for an A35 Chideock By-Pass until
 - a) a fully detailed route is established
 - b) there is a consensus from the residents of Chideock Parish to this route.
- 2. In view of the above, Chideock Parish Council will not make any contribution towards costs incurred by any pro or anti by-pass group in the parish
- 3. Chideock Parish Council re-affirms the resolution of 28 June 2016 "Chideock Parish Council's policy on the A35 is to take forward 2 objectives:
 - a) Introduction of a Low Emission Zone in Chideock

b) Instigation of a Safety Audit to identify measures to improve Health and Safety in the village by dealing with traffic and traffic impacts on property and people."

If any matter is called to a vote then only people on the Chideock electoral role are eligible to vote.

Please note that the Annual Village Meeting is NOT a Parish Council meeting, it is a meeting of electors of Chideock civil parish.

Foss Orchard Car Park.

The car park at Foss Orchard is owned and maintained by the Parish Council. The revenue from the ticket machine and season tickets is reserved for repairs to the tarmac etc.

Parking charges apply **EVERY DAY** from 8 am to 6 pm, (**FREE** 6 pm–8 am) Season tickets are available for £10 a quarter or £40 a year.

If you would like to purchase a Season Ticket please contact the Clerk.

Mud and other debris on the Highway.

Please note that it is an offence under the Highways Act 1980 to deposit or cause deposit of mud, hedge trimmings, grass cuttings etc on any highway – pavements / footways / public footpaths and bridleways are included in the definition of a "highway".

Mud, hedge trimmings, grass cutting etc cause a hazard to vehicles, pedestrians and animals and block the rain water drains, which causes flooding.

Public Footpath and Bridleway issues.

Please let the Clerk or a Councillor know of any issues of which you are aware – broken stiles and gates, missing or poorly located signs, overgrown or obstructed paths etc., so that these can be brought to the attention of the Dorset County Council Rights of Way.


