"A RISEN CHURCH"

The title of my article this month is that of the final session of the Lent Course that some of us are studying at St Giles Church. I believe it is worth sharing the heart of this with a wider readership.

The Course Session begins with the following quotation, from the atheist philosopher Nietzsche: "I might believe in the Redeemer if his so called Christian followers looked more redeemed". The appropriate response to that challenging statement is "Ouch!" It is not only younger people who say that "Church is boring!" but many other people feel the same – even if too polite to say so.

Bishop Tom Wright says (in the course CD): "Nietzche makes a good point; if the Church is really just a religious form of Platonism – in other words the only thing that matters is my disembodied soul and whether it will get to a disembodied heaven, then we might as well look austere and miserable because all that counts is this disembodied thing." But Nietzsche should be wrong – Christianity isn't Platonism for the masses, but about life in its fullness and abundance now. So, the Risen Church, to be truly authentic, should also display a strongly life affirming atmosphere of Celebration.

A risen Lord needs a risen church, a Church that reflects the dynamic event that started it all off. The Church is built out of resurrection material – so what could it look like? The Course offers the following ideal characteristics:

Joyful: Instilling a deep-down smile in the presence of the joy of the God's love

Life-affirming: Inspiring people to live life to the full, and helping others do the same

Flexible: Developing a supple grace that leads us to be genuinely open to change.

'Everyone a Winner': The Church is at its best when everyone is welcome, nothing felt impossible.

And thus, finally, the Church is meant to look and behave like Jesus – just as he is an "Easter person", Christians are called by God to be an "Easter People". We are not perfect, but with God's help we can together journey towards a greater 'wholeness', bearing the marks of the Risen Christ. Our sense of joy needs to transform all we say, think and do – affecting the life of our church as well as our individual lives.

Please join us on Easter morning at St Giles Church, to celebrate this wonderful hope!




Coast to coast cycle ride for 'Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance' on 13th May 2018

NOT SURE WHAT A LOAN SHARK IS?

If you can answer yes to one or more of these questions you might be borrowing from a loan shark:

- •Did they offer you a cash loan?
- •Did they not give you paperwork?
- •Did they add huge amounts of interest or APR to your loan?
- •Have they threatened you?
- •Are you scared of people finding out?
- •Have they taken your bank card, benefit card, passport, watch or other valuables from you?

To lend money lawfully you have to be authorised by the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA). People who lend money without being FCA authorised are breaking the law. They are known as loan sharks.

Loan sharks often work from home and start out friendly, but their behaviour changes when payments are missed. Few advertise; they are often heard of by word of mouth. Often little or no paperwork is provided and they will refuse to tell you how much you owe, how long you will be paying off the debt, or what the interest rate is. Many loan sharks will increase the debt and add additional amounts and take items as security including passports, bank cards or benefit cards.

They might also resort to intimidation, threats and violence. If you have borrowed from a loan shark you have not committed a crime, they have.

If a loan shark threatens you or acts in a violent way, contact the police straight away.

The England Illegal Money Lending Team work in Dorset to tackle loan sharks and support people affected by illegal money lending, on behalf of Dorset County Council Trading Standards Service.
