
Fund raiser at Chideock Film Club

DOGS MUST ON A LEAD

A35 Matters.

In reference to the recent article in the Bridport News stating that Dorset County Council is not supporting a bypass for Chideock, Chideock Parish Council points out that the document in question is DCC's response to the Department for Transport consultation on proposals for the creation of a new road network category, the "Major Road Network". The consultation ended on 19 March 2018.

The A35 is a Trunk Road and part of the Strategic Road Network, so DCC could not include it in their response to the MRN consultation.

Chideock Parish Council does not oppose the Parish Poll vote for a bypass outside the parish boundary but wishes to concentrate on shorter term initiatives to improve safety and reduce pollution.

The Highways England commissioned "community severance" study has been completed and the report is in preparation. Once it is available it will be published on the Parish Council website. The study looked at the issues caused by the A35 cutting through the villages of Chideock, Morecombelake and Winterbourne Abbas and how they could be alleviated.

Public Toilets at Seatown (and elsewhere in Dorset)

You may be aware that the decision has been taken that, due to financial constraints and following Local Government reorganisation next year, public conveniences will no longer be operated by the new Dorset Council, which comes into being on 1 April 2019.

There is no statutory duty for any level of local government to provide public toilets. However, all levels, including Town and Parish Councils, have a statutory power to do this.

Town and Parish Councils have the option to take over the freehold of toilets and their maintenance, with a cash sum to cover estimated operating costs for 2 years. Where this does not happen, the public conveniences will be closed.

In addition, there is a grant of £20,000 per public convenience for refurbishment if and where necessary. The District Council will not be able to undertake any refurbishment schemes before it ceases to exist, so the Public Conveniences must be refurbished by the Parish or Town Council to the standard required.

The Parish Council is considering the financial and other implications of the offer and will be asking for elector's views later in the year.

There is no statutory duty for any level of local government to provide public toilets, however, all levels have the power to do so.

Keeping roads, pavements, street lights and signs clear of vegetation.

The following advice has been received from Dorset County Council for vegetation bordering roads and pavements maintained by them. The same advice applies to the A35, which is maintained by Connect on behalf of the Highways Agency.

"The cutting back of highway hedges and trees is the responsibility of the landowner or occupier on whose land the hedges and trees are growing.

It is the responsibility of all landowners or occupiers to ensure that their hedges and trees do not interfere with the safe use of public footways and roadways or obscure street lights and road signs."

Keeping Public Footpaths and Bridleways clear is the responsibility of the land owner.

If you find a Public Footpath or Bridleway which is overgrown or ploughed up etc or a damaged gate / stile etc then please contact the Dorset Rights of Way Team. This can be done online (see below) or via Dorset Direct, giving the Footpath / Bridleway number and the location of the problem.

The Dorset Rights of Way team will then either ask the land owner to sort out the issue or will add it to their own list of tasks. However, do not expect the problem to be rectified immediately — both Dorset Rights of Way and landowners have many demands on their time and resources.

Don't worry about whether the problem has already been reported - better it is reported many times than not at all.

Please note that stiles are the responsibility of the landowner but that the landowner does not have to make stiles suitable for dogs.

Dogs and Livestock.

Chideock is very fortunate in having a network of public footpaths over National Trust and privately-owned land. On public access land containing livestock, you must keep your dog on a short-fixed lead (no more than 2 m in length).

If your dog chases or attacks livestock or looks as if it is going to, the landowner or farmer is entitled to shoot it. When taking a dog through a field with livestock be aware that they may chase the dog, particularly if they have young. A cow with a calf can be more dangerous than a bull. Consider your safety and that of your dog.


