September Parish Council Meeting.

The next Parish Council meeting is at 7 pm on Tuesday 25 September.

The meetings from October onwards will revert to 10 am on the last Tuesday in the month.

Do come along if there is anything you would like to raise with the council – there is a Democratic Period near to the start of the meeting where you can have your say and ask questions.

A35 Update.

The westbound speed camera at Broadmead is operational and the eastbound one at the Village Hall should be in operation by the time you read this. The eastbound camera and housing have both had to be replaced, hence the delay.

The Police are still hoping to install average speed cameras but require agreement from Highways England. If there is no agreement the current cameras will be replaced with digital cameras in the 1st six months of 2019.

Sir Oliver Letwin MP is arranging a 2nd meeting for October with West Dorset District Council, Highways England, the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs and representatives from Chideock Parish Council to consider actions which could be taken to reduce air pollution, following a Highways England commissioned study.

Chideock Parish Council (continued)

The Highways England commissioned "community safety and severance" study, looking at the issues caused by the A35 cutting through the villages of Chideock, Morecombelake and Winterbourne Abbas, has been completed and the Parish Council hopes to receive a copy of the final report for Chideock late September / early October.

Public Toilets at Seatown.

The Parish Council has agreed, in principle, to the transfer of the freehold of the Seatown Public Conveniences to the Parish Council together with a cash sum to cover 2 years' operating costs plus a grant of up to £20,000 per public convenience for refurbishment, subject to the Parish Council developing a viable financial plan for the facility and on the understanding that this agreement can be withdrawn prior to 1 April 2019.

Elector's views will be sought later this year as part of developing the financial plan. This will be done via the Chideock News, asking for people to make their views known either by e-mail, post or a "response" box in the Chideock Stores. There will not be a formal "parish poll".

Keeping Public Footpaths and Bridleways clear is the responsibility of the land owner.

If you find a Public Footpath or Bridleway which is overgrown or ploughed up etc or a damaged gate / stile etc then please contact the Dorset Rights of Way Team. This can be done online (see below) or via Dorset Direct, giving the Footpath / Bridleway number and the location of the problem.

The Dorset Rights of Way team will then either ask the land owner to sort out the issue or will add it to their own list of tasks. However, do not expect the problem to be rectified immediately — both Dorset Rights of Way and landowners have many demands on their time and resources.

Don't worry about whether the problem has already been reported - better it is reported many times than not at all.
