Spotlight

Many years ago when I was taking part in a Stewardship campaign a friend whom I was visiting asked me 'How do you know that there is a Heaven?' At the time, long before my Ministry began, I would have thought that I would be unable to give an answer. However, something within me immediately replied 'I don't know that there is a Heaven, but I believe there is such a place. One day we'll discover the truth.'

Hundreds of years ago we had no idea how large the universe was. We thought of the universe as the Earth, Sun and Moon and a handful of planets and stars. In that context Christianity was less challenging. Today it is very different, with expeditions to the Moon and Mars and space probes into the depths of the unknown. We are stunned and overwhelmed by the vast, immense size of our universe.

So today Christianity and indeed all faiths have to face up to new challenges. Can we still believe that God, the Creator, still has control over this masterpiece? Well, of course we can. Just because human beings lacked the ability to understand the size of the universe, the failings were theirs, not God's.

No scientist has yet been able to pinpoint exactly how the universe began. They can explain how it has evolved, but not the starting point. All religions are based on faith which can often be challenging and lead to doubts. We must trust the Holy Spirit within us to help us seek out the truth, to look back at events and history. Then our beliefs will be even stronger.

As I said to my friend all those years ago, 'One of us will learn the truth!'

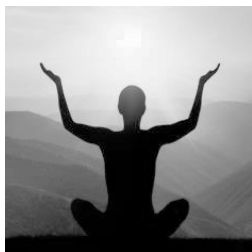

I MET A MAN THE OTHER DAY

I met a man the other day whilst on a long bus journey and we got talking. His life hadn't been easy and his problems had moulded his thinking about what the World offered. He questioned the fact that some people seem to have everything whilst others seemed to have very little. He'd had to move around many times as his circumstances changed – he knew what it was to go without. Sadly, he also knew that, when he had great need, those who could have helped him cold-shouldered him.

Eventually he asked me this question: What had I done for a living? I told him that I had been trained as a surveyor, but that for the last 35 years I had been helping needy people whom God had sent along my path in the Christian Ministry. I could see that this really surprised him.

Like so many of us he had been 'sent' to Sunday school as a child and had vivid memories of cold churches and hard pews. It seemed meaningless to him then, and still does. Maybe you too can relate to similar experiences?

After a long time of silence he suddenly blurted out his analysis of Christianity as he saw it and had experienced it. He said that he did believe in God, but his life of hard knocks had led him to resolve NEVER to go to church again – clearly he had been let down by the church when he had a need.

He quickly followed up with an impressive list of his good works and his generosity to people he met who needed help. On a weekly basis he helped at various charities ... but he didn't see life from God's perspective.

After all, he said, that if heaven were real ... he chose to believe that God (who was meant to be a God of Love) would surely look favourably upon all his good works and generosity to the needy ... and then let him into heaven.

Christian ministers hear this refrain so often ... but it's not true ... it's purely wishful thinking. To become a Christian it follows that we must follow God's instructions in the Holy Bible. Every club and organisation has its own entry requirements, and Christianity is no different.

So ... ok ... the Holy Bible is a big book ... but the entry requirements are there in the Gospels. Jesus needs each one of us to meet with Him by getting ourselves right with Him by acknowledging our past wrong behaviour (sins). He calls each one of us to REPENT, because all of us have fallen short of His standards for living in all sorts of different ways.

Yes, heaven is real, but we don't get there by making up our own entry ideas. You might like to imagine it in this way: God is sitting in the ticket office ... waiting for us to come and get a VALID TICKET ... for the journey to heaven.

He isn't interested in how much money we have given to charities, or how much we propose to leave to the local church when we pass on. He isn't interested in all our goodwill gestures, or how many days we have helped at charitable institutions.

God is waiting patiently at the ticket office for us to take time out IN THIS LIFE to get right with Him, and it must be done whilst time is on our side.

So what is the way forward?

What do we have to do to find Him?

Can God really help me to find meaning and peace of mind in this life?

My recommendation is to search out your local Christian bookshop (or go online) and ask which local church is offering the Alpha Course. This course is a good way to discover what Christianity is all about. It's free, and there are opportunities to ask questions of people who know the answers.

Saying sorry to God for things we've got wrong isn't enough – God wants a deep and sincere recognition and a commitment to change our ways. Jesus said, 'Seek first the Kingdom' (Mr.6v33).

Chideock Parish Council meets at 10:00 am on the last Tuesday of the month. There is no meeting in August or December.

Do come along if there is anything you would like to raise with the council – there is a Democratic Period near the start of the meeting where you can have your say and ask questions.

Here you will find lots of information about the Parish Council, how it works and what it does.

Information for forthcoming Parish Council meetings is published on the Thursday before the meeting and the minutes of meetings are published within 28 days, usually much sooner.

A Very Big Thank You to Lyn Crisp and Teresa Mudford.

Lyn and Teresa have decided to “retire” from maintaining Clapp’s Mead Playing Field and the Children’s Play Area. They have diligently maintained Clapp’s Mead for the last 17 years and feel that their days of painting, hedge removing etc., are now over. They will continue to monitor the Playing Field and Play Area and for this current year Teresa will continue to mow the Play Area and strim where necessary.

The day-to-day work consists of

- Weekly mowing and strimming the children’s play area – approx. March to September
- Keeping nettles and brambles at bay
- Dealing with potential trip hazards and overhanging branches etc.
- Replacing fence slates as necessary

Annual tasks include

- Fence painting
- Goal post painting
- Ensuring that the perimeter bushes, hedging etc do not intrude on the playing field
- General maintenance of the area.

Other less frequent tasks include

- Painting play equipment (the newer wooden items don’t need painting)
- Keeping the ditches / stream clear – this is an outstanding task.

The Parish Council will consider how to proceed on this for future as part of setting the Budget and Precept, starting in October and ending in January.

Chideock Parish Council news (continued) ...

A **reminder** – Clapp’s Mead Playing Field was granted to the Parish Council in 1938 by the Grafton family to be held **on behalf of the village** for recreation in perpetuity – it is **YOUR** playing field.

A35 Speed Limit Reduction Trial.

Please note that the Highways England letter gives the wrong eastern start point for the 30-mph limit.

It has not changed – it still starts just outside the village on the Bridport side.

Help Still Needed to Renovate Fingerposts.
