CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT 2018/19

Another year has passed, and your committee is still managing to keep the Village Hall going and make one or two new improvements to the hall.

We had a limited plan of work for 2018/19 and then the problems began! So, what has happened since the last AGM:

Our main planned work this year was to carry out the up grading of the heating and redecorate the main hall; the work on the heating was completed during the summer period; the redecorating of the main hall will now have to wait until funds allow. As we already had the paint, we were able to decorate the committee room and the male/female toilets, although there remains the gloss paint work still to be completed in this area.

This leaves the disabled WC to be upgraded which will now have to wait until hot water for the toilet block is connected to the main hall hot water system.

Chairman's report (continued) ...This will cost money to carry out the work but save money in the long run as we will be able to de-commission the current electric water heater.

While carrying out work on the stage during January, we discovered asbestos L143 which could not be left in place or protected and therefore needed to be professionally removed at the princely sum of £3,500 (including the cost of surveys and testing).

As I stated last year, we needed to carry out work on the timber retaining wall which had rotted and was making the rear Fire escape route unsafe. We now have the retaining wall re-built in blockwork thanks to Nick Mudford. The broken concrete path has also been repaired and thanks to donations of materials from David Jones the shingle and mud path along the west-end of the hall has been replaced with paving slabs and a post and rail fence. The outside lighting along this route has also been replaced and/or updated.

During the Summer there was a power failure caused by the new cooker, which I am happy to report has been resolved and is now working well. However this alerted us to the fact that although all the electrics in the hall are safe and have been regularly tested, resetting the main trip posed a major H&S risk which in this day and is unacceptable in public buildings. I am pleased to report that the main incoming supply and distribution board has now been replaced making the resetting of the breaker safe.

There have also been many minor maintenance items, too numerous to mention, which have kept David and myself busy throughout the year.

Our Treasurer Roger Carey has done exceptionally well this year, despite the problems we have faced, all of which have financial implications, but which the committee felt could not be left and needed prompt action. I will not steal his thunder and let him give you the facts and figures.

Once again, many thanks to Gloria and her team of Jane, Julia, Frances and Sue who have so successfully run the Community Café for another year. All the team put a great amount of effort in to make everyone welcome with an astounding supply of delightful cakes. This is **not repeat not** a fund raising event, although I know that many of you make donations which go to a number of deserving local charities selected by Gloria and the team. The idea behind the Community Café is for villagers and friends to be able to come to the hall to meet and chat over a cup or two of tea or coffee (with as much cake as you can reasonably eat) in the spirit of good neighbourliness.

Your committee needs as many active members as we can persuade to join us, more hands make light work, so if anyone would like to be involved in a worthwhile village project (so many activities in the village could not take place without the village hall), please join us.

Chairman's report (continued) ...As I have reported in previous years H&S is now an integral part of the running of this hall, we are committed to ensuring that everyone using it stays as safe as possible. Through regular H&S reviews we keep up with changing requirements. Your Committee is aware that there may be more items to be addressed so please bring to our attention any of your concerns.

Disappointingly we have been unable to progress the H&S problem which was brought to our attention concerning the emergency exit at the end of the hall, which opens onto the A35. We are now going to take this matter up directly with Highways England.

Bookings for the Hall from the Chideock community continue to be reasonably healthy, however there are a few slots in the calendar it would be nice to fill as we do now have some excellent facilities which we would like as many people as possible to enjoy.

Big thanks to:

- 1 Jeanette Smith & Rob Murray who have once again done a sterling job in looking after our garden.
- 2 Sue Walliker who manages the hall bookings so well.
- 3 David Jones, Paul Ramsden & Roger Carey without whose help endless bits of maintenance work would not get done.
- 4 Thanks to Bev, Moira and Pam for successfully running the bingo.
- 5 Thanks also to Paul Ramsden for all his work as hall secretary in particular his efforts with trying to register the hall with Land Registry.
- 6 A big thanks to all of the committee and members of the village who continue who support the village hall, without them I could not do the job of Chairman. I know this year we are going to lose one of our long serving committee members Moira Lucas; Moira has served the hall and Chideock Players committee for many; many years and she will be sadly missed. However I am not sure if it was a moment of weakness or if she weakened when she saw the look of horror on my face when she said she was going, that she said she would still help us out from time to time, so once again many thanks to you Moira.

Finally, as I have now served as Village Hall Chairman for 6 years, way longer than our rules state, I am more than happy to stand down and let someone else take over.

Chideock Village Hall **Treasurers' Report 15th November 2019**

It has been a very mixed year for the finances of the village hall as we were hoping to at least break even until the discovery of asbestos behind the stage.

We had no option but to remove this asbestos but it cost us £3500 including the survey & tests to confirm that it was in fact L143, professional removal of the asbestos and install ancilliary woodwork and repair local boarding. This combined with H & S work depleted our funds but still has left us with a healthy bank balance.

Our general fund which is made up from hall hire, bingo, whist and table tennis has increased over 2018 largely due to better attendance at bingo and whist. However, this may be reversed in the coming year due to bingo now only being played once a month. Our general expenditure has also gone down against 2018 largely due to the decrease in gas and electricity bills. This decrease is due to a prudent control of the heating and the new LED lights giving us a saving. We were thus able to transfer money from the general fund to the refurbishment fund. The film night has continued to be a good source of revenue and helped to put money into the refurbishment kitty.

In addition to the expenditure on asbestos removal we have spent over £8500 this year on the further refurbishment of the hall including £4500 on the new radiators, plus the very necessary H & S work on the stage, a new wall by the escape route, handrailing and perimeter fence. Other expenditure included the replacement of some of the gutters and work on the inspection chambers for the toilet block.

In this last year we received grants from Bridport Carnival, a S106 grant from DCC and money from Waitrose Community fund. I am hoping to get a grant again from the Co-op and I am in the process of applying for grants from other organisations plus I will apply for gift aid funding. We have decided to freeze hall hire charges for the second year running but it may be necessary to increase this in 2021. However, we must not become complacent but need to continue with cost cutting exercises and to raise money either by fundraising events or seek further grants. Finally, thanks also go to Chris Walliker for his freely given time in auditing our year end accounts and to Sue Walliker for admirably looking after the hall bookings.

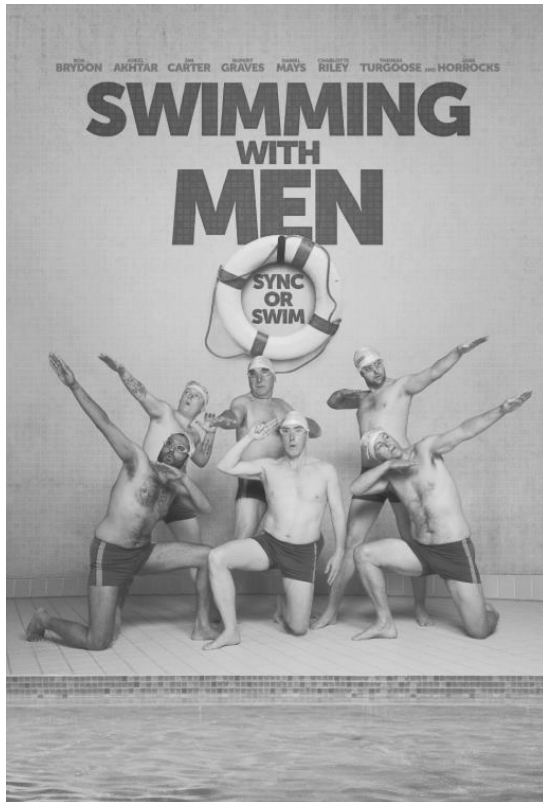

Information for forthcoming Parish Council meetings is published on the website on the Thursday before the meeting and the minutes of meetings are published within 28 days, usually much sooner. A copy of the agenda is posted on the Parish Council noticeboard, at the village shop. **Copies of recent correspondence with external bodies is now available on the website.**

Vegetation Overhanging Footways.

A reminder that it is the responsibility of the owner/occupier of land or property to ensure that vegetation growing on their land impede pedestrians using the footway.

A35 Update – Speed Limit Reduction Trial.

The reduction of the current 40mph section on the west side of Chideock (to 30 mph), along with the reduction of the current national speed limit between Chideock and Morcombelake (to 50mph), is now in place. Speed monitoring has been carried out and the Parish Council is waiting to hear the results and the details of any future enforcement measures which Highways England considers necessary. Highways England will communicate the progress and results of the trial to the Parish Council and suggest that any questions are channelled through the council.
