SPOTLIGHT ARTICLE March 2022

I always find that this time of year it is a time of reflection. What has happened in the recent past, and what lies ahead? I have been watching some of the church choirs who appear on Songs of Praise on BBC television and noticed a great variation in the way they sing their hymns. At one extreme there is the solemn faced, traditional form of singing, and at the other end, the Gospel choirs, smiling, swaying their bodies, holding their hands up to the Lord.

The latter conveys such joy, enthusiasm and ecstasy. That doesn't mean to say that the more traditional way of singing is in any way inferior. It is just that you cannot see that inner happiness on the outside. Everyone must find their own level, each to their own, but perhaps just add a smile as you sing! As psalm 33 says 'shout for joy in the Lord, you that are righteous, praise comes well from the upright.'

In the place where you live how well do you know your neighbours? How many could you name? If you were ill and housebound tomorrow what help could you expect from them? This of course is what we call today 'community.' In St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, chapter 12, verses 1 to 11, he states that God gives gifts to all his people. Nobody is left out and all the gifts given by God are not only good gifts, but are gifts perfectly suited to fills the needs of the recipient.

In any community all the gifts necessary for the well being of those people will be found, as we have seen during the pandemic. But of course, in order to use your own particular skills you have to go out to use them for the benefit of others. Unexpectedly, such gifts could be humour or reliability or getting on well with other people.

There are many examples of good deeds in our community, let us make sure that we use our own God given gifts for the benefit of our neighbours. By such deeds will we be known.

We have two dedicated volunteers for Chideock, Morcombelake and Charmouth areas

The Home Library Service brings books to people who can no longer get to a library. It operates from Bridport and Charmouth libraries

Volunteers deliver books and share their love of reading with the people they visit. They are a friendly face and a regular visitor to those whose mobility and social interactions are limited, and they provide a useful check on the safety and well-being of their readers, too.

One of our readers commented: "It is an excellent service; it's a real delight when it is hard to get to the library oneself. The volunteer is so friendly, they may be the only person I shall see all day."

Maria Jacobson, service manager for Dorset Home Library Service, says, "For people who enjoy reading or listening to an audio recording but find getting out of the house challenging, this service offers a vital link to the local library. The service enables them to carry on doing something they've always enjoyed and helps alleviate feelings of isolation and loneliness."

The Home Library Service is delivered free of charge; it is not only for older people, but for anybody who finds getting to the library difficult, including carers.

Please note that the Clerk works 30 hours per month so may not respond immediately. The Council continues to lobby various individuals, organisations, and bodies regarding the A35 issues experienced by the village. Parish Council Meetings are now being held in-person at the Village Hall.

The next meeting is at 10 am on Tuesday 29 March.

The Parish Council continues to follow COVID-19 instructions issued by the Village Hall Committee.

Parish Council Meeting Start Time.

The May, June, July, and September meetings will start at 7pm. The April meeting will still be in the morning as the Village Hall has already been booked by another group for that evening.

The meetings in March 2022, April, October, November, January, February, and March 2023 will start at 10am.

What do you think??

Chideock Parish Council wants your views on 2 items: -

- 1. Should dogs be on lead at Clapp's Mead Playing Field? This excludes the Children's Play area which is no dogs.
- 2. Should a new direction sign be erected in Duck Street just prior to the Mill Lane junction going south, showing Mill Lane as a "No Through Road" and Sea Hill Lane as leading to the beach? It will have to be paid for by the Parish at a cost of £288.14.

The post box on the corner of Duck Street and Main Street is not suitable for larger items – forcing something in just blocks it. Which means that either other things can't be posted at all or they can be taken out by anyone passing. Larger items should be handed in at the Chideock Stores for collection by the postman.

Budget and Precept for 2021 – 2020.

The Budget and Precept for 2022 – 2023 was approved at the Parish Council meeting on 25 January 2022.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION.

The budget for 2021-2022 includes a maintenance grant of £700 to the Village Hall, which will be paid at the end of March 2022.

The budget for 2022 - 2023 includes the amount of £1,835 for "Grants to External Bodies". Village Groups will be invited to apply in late 2022 with the grants being made at the end of March 2023. This obviously includes the Village Hall. There is also scope for a grant to be made to non-village groups, e.g., the Bridport Citizen's Advice Bureau, which is an external body of which anyone in Chideock can make use.

This change has been made because an increased sum been allocated for grants, and councillors agreed that a more democratic way of allocating these funds should be taken – as is done by many other parish councils.

Keep safe, register your appliance

The UK trade association for the Manufacturers of Domestic Electrical Appliances (AMDEA) is asking people to register their household appliances to keep homes safe. Both new and already in use appliances can be registered through the scheme. Product Registration allows people to be contacted more quickly in the event of their appliance being subject to a safety recall.

Consumers are being encouraged to register new and in-use household appliances with the manufacturer, or through the website registermyappliance.org.uk

Consumer research into product safety found that 83% percent of people who registered a product were primarily motivated by getting or extending a warranty. The survey also found the reasons respondents did not register appliances was because they did not want to or did not believe it was necessary (46%), or because they did not know they could register it (17%).

The Office for Product Safety and Standards is working with AMDEA to increase the registration of household appliances by advising consumers it will help make their homes safer. They recommend:

Register all your appliances. Check that all your household appliances are registered so you will know if they have been recalled. Many manufacturers will allow you to register household appliances that are up to twelve years old. Most household products can also be registered through registermyappliance.org.uk

Check whether small appliances are registered. Faulty toasters and kettles can cause fires. Register with the manufacturer to get recall notices before it is too late. Landlords make sure your products are covered in properties you own. Check that all the household appliances are registered so that you are contacted quickly if they are recalled. Check that products are registered in rented accommodation. Check that the owner has registered the household appliances. If they have not you should register the products yourself.
