The Council continues to lobby various individuals, organisations, and bodies regarding the A35 issues experienced by the village. Parish Council Meetings are now in-person at the Village Hall. The next 2 meetings are at 7pm on Tuesday 26 July and 7pm on Tuesday 27 September.

Community Speed Watch.

PSCO Alex Bishop has informed the council that the Chideock Speed Watch scheme **cannot** be resurrected now that both speed cameras are working.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations.

The Parish Council thanks the Friends of Clapp's Mead for organising an extremely successful and enjoyable event to celebrate this unique occasion. Thanks also to those who provided stalls of various kinds on the Sunday, and St Giles Church for the service on Sunday.

Hell Lane and Shutes Lane.

A Temporary Traffic Management Order for 21 days from 27 May to 17 June has been issued, closing both to all vehicles. <u>This is the first of 3 notices</u> relating to this closure which is anticipated to stay in place until November 2023.

Dorset Highways has assessed the condition of both lanes and is now determining what affordable remedial action could be taken. Both Hell Lane and Shutes Lane are Unclassified County Roads.

Chideock Bridge Parapet.

The following update has been received from Connect Balfour Beaty: "We can confirm we now have a suitable Stone Mason to carry out the
works. Andy Genge our Technician is arranging a meeting between them
and the listed building expert as soon as possible to start the works."

Pedestrian Crossing.

The was a fault with the controls which is why the lights weren't changed as they should. This has been fixed.

Co-option to Fill the Casual Vacancy.

A casual vacancy has arisen due to Tony Peacock moving from the village. There was no request by 10 electors for an election (deadline 24 May), so the vacancy must, if possible, be filled by co-option.

Do you enjoy living in Chideock, and would you like to play a part in decision making for the village? If so, have you considered joining the Parish Council? The council needs a good mix of people living or working in the parish; 18 years and over, working age, or retired.

Do you possess any, all or some of the following skills?

Good at mediation, forward thinking, like helping others, enjoy lively debate, can make awkward decisions without fear or favour, interested in learning how some of our lives are run by others, have a large amount of common sense, and can agree to disagree with others who may not share your views?

If your answer is **YES** to any of the above, why not share your skills to benefit the village? A Parish Council has few powers but is the means by which those who do have power can be contacted and chased up on their responsibilities to communities.

Training is provided by the Dorset Association of Parish and Town Councils (DAPTC) and expenses are paid for cost of travel made on behalf of the Parish Council.

More information on being a councillor can be found on the Parish Council website under the 2019 Elections tab or contact Sal Robinson, the Clerk.

If successful, you will be required to complete an entry in the parish council's register of members' interests. This involves putting your address, employment, relevant major shareholdings and membership of charities, pressure groups, political parties etc., on public record.

Qualifying Criteria to be a councillor: -

- Age 18 or over
- One of the following conditions applies:
 - is an elector of the Parish
 - has for the previous 12 months owned or rented land or premises in the Parish
 - has for the previous 12 months worked primarily within the Parish
 - has for the past 12 months either resided in the Parish or within 3 miles of it

Applications must be received by the Clerk on or before 15 July Applicants will be invited to attend the Parish Council meeting on 26 July to give a short summary of why they wish to be a councillor. Current councillors will then vote.

Vegetation Overhanging Footways and Watercourses.

A reminder that it is the responsibility of the owner or occupier of land or property to ensure that

a) vegetation growing on their land does not impede pedestrians using a footway of any kind

- b) vegetation growing on their land does not restrict visibility for pedestrians and drivers
- c) vegetation growing on their land does not overhand the carriageway where there is no footway
- d) vegetation or other material from their land does not in any way impede the flow of water, which includes anything overhanging the watercourse which could, in severe weather, trap material being carried downstream.

In addition, please ensure that vegetation trimmings are not left on a footway or carriageway of any kind nor allowed to fall into a watercourse.

Reporting Issues to the Relevant Body.

<u>Environmental issues</u> – ring the Environment Agency - 0800 80 70 60 – they will ask for a nearby postcode.


