Please note that the Clerk works 30 hours per month so may not respond immediately to enquiries. The Parish Council continues to lobby various individuals, organisations, and bodies regarding the A35 issues experienced by the village.

The next Parish Council meetings are at 10am on 30 May and 27 June.

Casual Vacancy.

A casual vacancy has arisen due to Deirdre Coates' resignation after 4 years on the council.

The Parish Council thanks her for her input over the past 4 years and for her work with Mr Maskall on the long awaited but still to come all weather pedestrian and cycle route from Chideock towards Bridport. Deirdre will continue to work on this with Mr Maskall.

The Parish Council will know on 1 June whether 10 electors have requested a formal election.

If no election has been requested the Parish Council will be asking people to come forward for co-option to the council.

So, keep an eye on the Parish Council website, Facebook page and the noticeboard in Foss Orchard Car Park for updates.

Annual Village Meeting.

The Parish Council was very pleased to see so many people at the meeting on 26 April and to hear what Village Groups are doing. Andy Mears (Wessex Water) gave a presentation on the Chideock Storm Overflow system. Peter Stapleton (Winniford River Action Group) then gave a presentation about how WRAG was formed and what it is doing to measure pollution of various types in the Winniford.

Vegetation Overhanging Footways, Carriageways and Watercourses.

A reminder that it is the responsibility of the owner or occupier of land or property to ensure that: -

- vegetation growing on their land does not impede the passage of pedestrians, push chairs, wheelchairs, mobility scooters, etc from safely using a footway of any kind.
- vegetation growing on their land does not restrict visibility for pedestrians and drivers.
- growing on their land does not overhand the carriageway where there is no footway.
- vegetation or other material from their land does not in any way impede the flow of water, which includes anything overhanging the watercourse which could, in severe weather.
- trap material being carried downstream.

In addition, please ensure that no vegetation trimmings are left on a footway or carriageway of any kind nor allowed to fall into a watercourse.

Please check your boundaries next to roads, pavements, footpaths, and watercourses (including ditches) to make sure that there are no issues and that any adjacent road drains are clear with no obstructions which could stop rainwater flowing into them.

Reporting Issues to the Relevant Body.

Sewage / water leakages in public areas - ring the Wessex Water Operations on 0345 600 4600 with as much information as to the location as possible, preferably a post code.

Environmental issues – ring the Environment Agency - 0800 80 70 60 – they will ask for a nearby postcode.
