



The Parish Council continues to lobby various individuals, organisations, and bodies regarding the A35 issues experienced by the village.

Parish Council Meetings are in-person at the Village Hall. The next meeting is at 10am on Tuesday 23 October.

#### Casual Vacancy.

The two Causal Vacancies remain unfilled. If you think you may be interested in becoming a councillor more information can be found on the Parish Council website under the 2019 Elections tab or contact Steven Rose, the Clerk.

#### Traffic incidents on the A35.

when making a report, though this may be helpful if further details are required.

#### Parking on Sea Hill Lane.

CPC's attention was drawn to a recent incident when emergency vehicles were called to Seatown and were delayed by several minutes as they struggled to get past cars parked in Sea Hill Lane (see below). CPC is aware that parking on this stretch of Sea Hill Lane is NOT illegal but would respectfully ask all car owners to ensure that when parking their vehicles here they do so leaving as much passing space as possible.

#### Meeting with Bridport Lengthsman.

The Parish Council met with the Bridport Town Council lengthsman who is responsible for maintaining Clapps Mead playing field and aspects of the Foss Orchard car park hedge. He is providing a costing for clearing the ditches around the playing field, and will be servicing the hedge, reducing the height to between 6ft and 7ft, as well as maintaining the other grassy areas of the car park.

#### **Vegetation Overhanging Footways and Watercourses.**

A reminder that it is the responsibility of the owner or occupier of land or property to ensure that

- a) vegetation growing on their land does not impede pedestrians using a footway of any kind
- b) vegetation growing on their land does not restrict visibility for pedestrians and drivers
- c) vegetation growing on their land does not overhand the carriageway where there is no footway
- d) vegetation or other material from their land does not in any way impede the flow of water, which includes anything overhanging the watercourse which could, in severe weather, trap material being carried downstream.

In addition, please ensure that vegetation trimmings are not left on a footway or carriageway of any kind nor allowed to fall into a watercourse.

<u>Environmental issues</u> – ring the Environment Agency - 0800 80 70 60 – they will ask for a nearby postcode.
