been working on an amazing project to make comfort teddies for people seeking help from STARS, a Dorset charity that helps people of all ages who have suffered from any form of sexual violence in their life. Before the teddies were handed to the charity they had a fun day away at Training Camp – a sort of Outward Bound for bears. It was all a bit chaotic but we stopped the naughty teddies before anyone was hurt. You can see their activities in the picture.

Our monthly meeting was all about the swans at Abbotsbury. Charlie Wheeler the Manager of the venue, as well as a Warden on the Fleet Lagoon and a brilliant amateur photographer gave us a fascinating and educational talk on his 'herd'. Would you believe that at the height of winter there can be up to 1000 mute swans congregating on the lagoon eating the eel grass that grows in abundance in the shallow brackish water. Swans have been at Abbotsbury for 600 years, first bred for food by the monks who were not allowed meat but had a clear conscience about eating cygnets on a Friday because the meat looked like fish! Each swan is ringed and recorded and the Swannery is building up a unique scientific record of the birds.

We are very excited about our Fuller Talk this year which will be held on Saturday 16 March (see separate poster). We are lucky enough to have as our speaker Kevin Lygo who is the Director of Television at ITV and also an expert on Byzantium. His talk entitled "From Love Island to Byzantium" will cover his life in television where he is responsible for programmes such as Dancing on Ice and Mr Bates vs the Post Office, as well as his passionate interest in Byzantine history. There will be a bar and tasty nibbles including some with an Eastern Mediterranean flavour. Open to all, this will be a very popular event so buy your tickets early to ensure a place.

The Council continues to lobby various individuals, organisations, and bodies regarding the A35 issues experienced by the village.

Parish Council Meetings are in-person at the Village Hall at 10 am on the last Tuesday of each month except August and December. The next Parish Council meeting is 26 March.

Elections for all Parish / Town Councils in the Dorset Council area, Dorset Council itself, and the Police and Crime Commissioner will be held on 2 May 2024.

They can be submitted to Dorset Council after March 11th, which is when the formal Notice of Election will be made.

Do you enjoy living in Chideock, and would you like to play a part in decision making for the village? If so, have you considered becoming a Parish

Councillor? The council needs a good mix of people living or working in the parish; 18 years and over, working age, or retired.

Do you possess any, all or some of the following skills?

Good at mediation, forward thinking, like helping others, enjoy lively debate, can make awkward decisions without fear or favour, interested in learning how some of our lives are run by others, have a large amount of common sense, and can agree to disagree with others who may not share your views?

If your answer is YES to any of the above, why not share your skills to benefit the village? A Parish Council has few powers but is how those who do have power can be contacted and chased up on their responsibilities to their communities.

Chideock Parish Council usually meets once a month; extra meetings are only called over an urgent matter. Meetings are held at 10 am on the last Tuesday of the month. No meeting is held in August or December unless an urgent issue arises.

Training is provided by the Dorset Association of Parish and Town Councils and expenses are paid for travel costs made on behalf of the Parish Council.

Why not attend a council meeting? The next 2 Parish Council meeting are at 10 am on 27 February and 26 March.

Chideock Flood Group.

Chideock Parish Council is asking for volunteers to form a Flood Group, which will be independent of the Parish Council, but will include at least 1 parish councillor.

This is a revival of the group set up in 2013 following the floods in July 2012. The group will

Liaise and meet with members of Dorset Council Highways and Flood Management Teams and with National Highways for the A35 Look out for and report matters which could affect rainwater drainage (for example blocked gullies and drain covers)

Maintain the sand bag store, ordering more bags as needed.

Members of the group could also hold sand bags for people living near them.

Please contact the Parish Clerk if you would like to be on the team.

Flooding.

Sandbags are available in the Community Sandbag Store in the car park to the rear of The Clock. These are available for free but **must be returned** to the store after use. They are for Chideock residents only.

Dorset Council supply these free of charge and more have been ordered.

Dorset Council is actively involved in remedying the drainage issues in the upper part of Sea Hill Lane. Further works are ongoing.

Both residents and Parish Councillors participate in site meetings with officers from Dorset Highways and the Dorset Council Flood Management team.

Electors must provide photo id when going to vote on 2 May.

A United Kingdom passport

A passport issued by a European Economic Area (EEA) state or a Commonwealth country.

A national identity card issued by an EEA state.

A UK driving licence (with photo, paper licences will not be accepted).

A driving licence issued by the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state.

A biometric immigration document.

An identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card).

A Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card).

Older Person's Bus Pass, Disabled Person's Bus Pass, Oyster 60+ Card, Freedom Pass.

A Blue Badge.

A free Voter Authority Certificate.

Vegetation Overhanging Footways and Watercourses.

A reminder that it is the responsibility of the owner or occupier of land or property to ensure that: -

- a) vegetation growing on their land does not impede pedestrians using a footway of any kind.
- b) vegetation growing on their land does not restrict visibility for pedestrians and drivers.
- c) vegetation growing on their land does not overhand the carriageway where there is no footway.
- d) vegetation or other material from their land does not in any way impede the flow of water, which includes anything overhanging the watercourse which could, in severe weather, trap material being carried downstream.

In addition, please ensure that vegetation trimmings are not left on a footway or carriageway of any kind nor allowed to fall into a watercourse.

The poignant story about a group of child survivors of the Holocaust rehabilitated in the UK. The very first lines, voiced over the titles, give you notice of what follows: "They tore me from my father's arm and took me away. This moment I will never, ever forget."

In 1945, shortly after the end of the Second World War, the British government agreed to take some 732 refugee Jewish children, survivors of the Nazis' extermination camps (and a tiny fraction of those murdered in those death factories). About 300, from toddlers to adolescents, were billeted in some huts near Windermere. There, under the solicitous care of guardians and a rabbi (played by Thomas Kretschmann, Tim McInnerney, and Konstantin Frank with sensitivity), as well as an art therapy teacher, played by Romola Garai, they find themselves rehabilitated, from starving, terrified children to normality, in a remarkable few months.
