In early May Chideock WI celebrated its 105th birthday – quite an achievement. Back in the day – just after the First World War - WI was probably one of the only organisations for village ladies to get together, socialise and learn new skills. These days there are so many other outlets for women but our membership continues to grow and we welcome new members. We still socialise and learn new skills but we also support initiatives to address issues that matter to members, from dental health to climate change and mental health to microplastic pollution.

During the meeting we were entertained by a fabulous local Appalachian Dance group called ‘No Mean Feet’. Five dancers and three musicians outlined the history of Appalachian dance which probably originates from Northumbrian clog dancing with a touch of Scottish and Irish dance thrown in. Those early nineteenth century settlers to the east coast of America certainly knew how to entertain themselves. The lively music and energetic dancing with the dancers’ tap shoes adding a pulsating percussive rhythm got our toes tapping and it wasn’t long before some of us were persuaded to join in. Well



the less said about that, the better, it’s certainly very energetic and the steps are quite difficult to remember.

Every birthday must have a tea and WI teas are renowned. Our birthday cake was cut by our newest member and everyone enjoyed the opportunity to chat whilst eating sandwiches, savouries, cakes and meringues. Our new programme for the next twelve months was handed out to members and we look forward to an exciting year ahead.

PLEA FOR HEATING 2024

Dear Chideock Villagers

As you know, we have a beautiful Grade 1 Listed church in our village. The history of the church goes back for many years.

However, things wear out and the heating has come to the end of its life.

The Parochial Church Council has decided to update the heating using a system that will be cost effective to run, and will both protect the fabric of the church for future generations, and keep the people warm.

We are aware of the environmental costs of fossil fuels, and want to make our contribution to reduce global warming. To this end, after having considered a number of options, the PCC has decided upon an electric heating system. We have already discontinued our gas supply and switched to Britain's biggest supplier of zero-carbon electricity.

However, new heating comes at a cost. We estimate that removing the old system and installing the new will cost approximately £40,000, and we shall be holding a variety of fundraising events, and, of course, applying for grants.

Naturally, we still have to pay for the normal running of the church which comes to over £20,000 per annum. This is funded by the giving of our congregation and fundraising events. We are also supported by The Friends Of St Giles. So we need the support of the village.

The Clerk will seek to acknowledge receipt of an email within one working day and respond within five working days.

The Council continues to lobby various individuals, organisations, and bodies regarding the A35 issues experienced by the village.

Parish Council Meetings are in-person at the Village Hall at 10 am on the last Tuesday of each month except August and December. The next Parish Council meetings are 25 June and 30 July.

Post-Election Vacancies – Call for Volunteers for Co-option.

There are 3 vacancies to be filled by co-option, as only 4 people were nominated for election.

Please contact the Clerk by 18 June if you would like to be considered for co-option, giving a summary of who you are, where you live, and why you wish to be a councillor.

It is anticipated that co-options will take place at the Parish Council meeting on 25 June.

Welcome to the new members of Chideock Parish Council.

Annual Village Meeting.

The Annual Village meeting will be held on Tuesday 28 May, 6.45 for 7pm. Tea and coffee will be served before the meeting.

This is not a Parish Council meeting – it is a meeting for electors of the parish. The Parish Council will give a resume of what has happened over the past 12 months, and the Dorset Ward Councillor and PCSO Bishop will be invited to speak.

Village groups who wish may give an update on their events.

There will be an opportunity for electors ask questions and raise issues.

Traffic incidents on the A35.

The Parish Council has added a page on its website for residents to report traffic incidents that occur on the A35, <http://www.chideockpc.org.uk/community/chideock-parish-council-14830/report-traffic-incident/>. You are not required to provide contact details when making a report, though this may be helpful if further details are required.

Vegetation Overhanging Footways and Watercourses.

A reminder that it is the responsibility of the owner or occupier of land or property to ensure that: -

- a) vegetation growing on their land does not impede pedestrians using a footway of any kind.
- b) vegetation growing on their land does not restrict visibility for pedestrians and drivers.
- c) vegetation growing on their land does not overhand the carriageway where there is no footway.
- d) vegetation or other material from their land does not in any way impede the flow of water, which includes anything overhanging the watercourse which could, in severe weather, trap material being carried downstream.

In addition, please ensure that vegetation trimmings are not left on a footway or carriageway of any kind nor allowed to fall into a watercourse.

Reporting Issues to the Relevant Body.

- Environmental issues – ring the Environment Agency - 0800 80 70 60 – they will ask for a nearby postcode.
- Reporting Rights of Way Issues – <https://gi.dorsetcouncil.gov.uk/rightsofway/reportproblem>
- Reporting Highway Issues – except for the A35 – including blocked drains -
 - <https://www.dorsetcouncil.gov.uk/roads-highways-maintenance/report-a-problem-on-the-road-or-pavement> - this excludes street lighting. **In an emergency ring 01305 221020 (24 hours). If there is immediate risk to safety, dial 999.**
- Reporting Highway Issues - A35.
 - **In non-urgent situations only**, report these to the Clerk or a councillor – this includes street lighting and **blocked drains**. **In an emergency ring 0300 123 5000 (24 hours). If there is immediate risk to safety, dial 999.**
- Reporting Street Light Issues, apart from on the A35 -

If you do not have internet access, please contact the Clerk or a councillor, with as much information as possible.

14 days to cool off.

If you arrange for a business to carry out work then you may be entitled, in writing, to a 14 day cooling-off period. This includes services such as gardening, roofing, home improvements, and many more.

You have this legal right to cancel and get a refund if you contracted for the service away from the business, like in your home, in the street, or workplace. Additionally, you may have cancellation rights for distance contracts purchased for instance on the internet, mail order or phone.

14 days is the absolute minimum cooling-off period that the business must give you.

You don't automatically get a cooling-off period if you have something specially made, for example made to measure curtains, windows, or a conservatory, or if you invite the business into your home for urgent repairs, such mending a burst pipe.

Your cooling-off period begins the day after you give the go-ahead for the work to be done. The business must give you details of how to cancel. If they don't provide these then your cooling-off period is extended by 14 days from the date you do receive them - up to a maximum of 1 year.

If the business hasn't started the work and you're still within the 14 days cooling-off period, then you can cancel and get all your money back.

If you signed the written notice to agree for the service to be provided during the cooling-off period, and the business gave you the written cancellation information, you'll have to pay a part of the agreed price. The amount will depend on how much was completed when you asked to cancel.

If the business began the work during the cooling-off period without your approval, you then have the right to cancel and get a full refund of all costs.

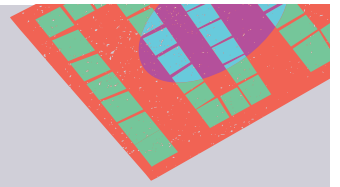

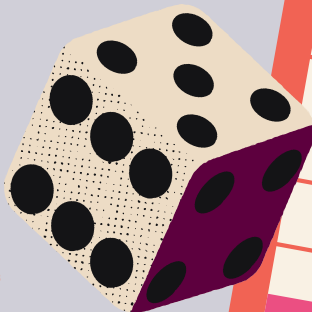
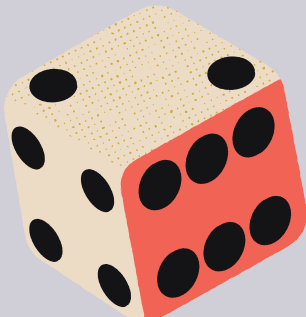
