PLEA FOR HEATING 2024

Dear Chideock Villagers

As you know, we have a beautiful Grade 1 Listed church in our village. The history of the church goes back for many years.

However, things wear out and the heating has come to the end of its life.

The Parochial Church Council has decided to update the heating using a system that will be cost effective to run, and will both protect the fabric of the church for future generations, and keep the people warm.

We are aware of the environmental costs of fossil fuels, and want to make our contribution to reduce global warming. To this end, after having considered a number of options, the PCC has decided upon an electric heating system. We have already discontinued our gas supply and switched to Britain's biggest supplier of zero-carbon electricity.

However, new heating comes at a cost. We estimate that removing the old system and installing the new will cost approximately £40,000, and we shall be holding a variety of fundraising events, and, of course, applying for grants.

Naturally, we still have to pay for the normal running of the church which comes to over £20,000 per annum. This is funded by the giving of our congregation and fundraising events. We are also supported by The Friends Of St Giles. So we need the support of the village.

BLLINK (Bridport to Lyme Link) News

Many of you will already know but we are deeply saddened to report the death of Winston Maskell (Meash) who has been the prime mover in attempting to establish a safe cycle and walking path through Chideock, linking Bridport and (eventually) Lyme Regis. It is due to his efforts and the generosity of Mr. & Mrs. Coates that a bridleway has been established along the North of the A35 to the East of the village from the entrance to Park Farm to Quarry Cross (Furches Hill) which is the most dangerous section of the route.

Those of us who have been working alongside Meash; Deirdre Coates, Will Grafton and myself (Cliff Allen), are determined that his vision for the path will be realised.

Unfortunately, work to fence and surface the path has had to stop temporarily because of a gas main running along its course. The Senior Ranger for Dorset Council (the officer responsible for public rights of way) is currently engaged in preparing the paperwork and arranging for a meeting with the company responsible for the gas pipeline (SGN) to assure them that the work can be done safely. At the time of writing exploratory excavations and a site meeting are due to take place in mid-August. We are optimistic that work will recommence in the Autumn.

We are continuing to explore how to complete the safe route to the pre-existing pavement at the former London Inn or West Road, Bridport and will report again with progress.

The Clerk will seek to acknowledge receipt of an email within one working day and respond within five working days.

The Council continues to lobby various individuals, organisations, and bodies regarding the A35 issues experienced by the village.

Parish Council Meetings are in-person at the Village Hall at 10 am on the last Tuesday of each month except August and December. The next Parish Council meetings are 30 July and 24 September. There is no meeting in August.

Update from the Air Quality Working Group.

Following the public meeting with Bristol University in May, the next steps have taken place with the University to plan where to distribute the small NO2 monitors around the village. These monitors are small and powered by batteries. The devices will be placed across all areas in Chideock and Seatown and be in place for a period of three months from the last week in July until October. It is envisaged that this period should provide sufficient data to establish both the density and the distribution of NO2 throughout the village due to air pollution from the A35. Alongside of this, larger monitors will be located in the identified sites (these sites have yet to be finalised) across the village in regard to particulate matter (arising from tyres, brakes, etc), and these will be in place for approximately 12 months, this will enable Bristol and the Parish Council to have a complete factual overview of the impact of air pollution due to the A35. Chideock Parish Council has written to the new

leader of Dorset Council to share the update on the project and requested further meetings with the Environment team.

Vegetation Overhanging Footways and Watercourses.

Please ensure that vegetation trimmings are not left on a footway or carriageway of any kind nor allowed to fall into a watercourse.

A reminder that it is the responsibility of the owner or occupier of land or property to ensure that: -

- a) vegetation growing on their land does not impede pedestrians using a footway of any kind.
- b) vegetation growing on their land does not restrict visibility for pedestrians and drivers.
- c) vegetation growing on their land does not overhand the carriageway where there is no footway.
- d) vegetation or other material from their land does not in any way impede the flow of water, which includes anything overhanging the watercourse which could, in severe weather, trap material being carried downstream.

CITIZEN'S ADVICE Used cars top complaints list

Citizens Advice has revealed that last year its Consumer Service received a complaint about a used car every three minutes.

The charity, which helped with almost 43,000 complaints relating to used cars in 2023 alone, found most of these complaints were about defective cars, around 1 in 10 being about car safety. The most common issues included faulty cars, damage people were not told about, and cars having a higher mileage than shown.

Consumers are often left out of pocket when purchasing a used car. But unexpected car problems can cost more than just money, they can leave people missing work or unable to drop their children off at school. Buying a used car can be complex and that means consumers can be left confused and without the knowledge and information needed to make well-informed buying decisions.

People may be rightfully wary of the 'Del Boy' type car traders, but there is just as much harm and bad practice lurking behind used car adverts on online platforms, such as Facebook. Car clocking is still an ongoing issue where a car's mileage is adjusted and not declared at the time of sale, that's a Trading Standards' offence.

For peace of mind its recommended that people buy a used car from a garage that is a member of the Consumer Codes Approval Scheme (CCAS). These garages follow a robust code of practice. If a problem does arise, all garages in the CCAS family offer free Alternative Dispute Resolution to help resolve the issue quickly and effectively.
