The reassuring thing, she told us, was not to worry about breaking any ribs when doing CPR as this showed you were pressing hard enough. She carefully guided us through using a defibrillator which took away much of its mystery. It was comforting to note that the machine gives clear instructions for you to follow and makes the decisions for you.

Helen clearly explained the difference between a cardiac arrest, a heart attack and a stroke. She was most generous with her time answering many questions which were of concern to members.

It proved to be an afternoon well spent.

This was followed by a sumptuous afternoon tea provided by Caroline and Diane; thank you both.

# **Help for Book Readers Accessing Lyme Library**



**Dorset's Home Library Service** (HLS), run by the Royal Voluntary Service (RVS) across Dorset is looking to grow its *free service for people who can't get to the library due to health or mobility issues in the Lyme Regis area.* The Home Library Service brings books to people who can no longer get to the library for free on a monthly basis and operates from Lyme Library, through a team of RVS volunteers living in the area.

The volunteers choose and/or deliver books, after an initial assessment visit to establish the readers' needs and preferences. They share their love of reading with the people they visit and are a friendly face, regularly visiting those whose mobility and social interactions are limited, and they provide a useful check on the safety and well-being of their readers, too.

Ian Rumble, Volunteer Coordinator for the HLS in the Lyme area, says, "For people who enjoy reading or listening to audio recordings, but find getting out of the house challenging, this service offers a vital link to Lyme Library and the wider resources of libraries throughout Dorset and beyond. The service enables them to carry on doing what they've always enjoyed and helps alleviate feelings of isolation or loneliness and puts a smile on their faces"

The Home Library Service was recognised earlier this year for its "great and valuable services to the community in enhancing their lives" throughout Dorset when it received the High Sheriff of Dorset's Award at a ceremony in March. Incumbent High Sheriff, Anthony Woodhouse, presented Maria Jacobson, Service Manager for RVS' HLS in Dorset, with the award and spoke of Royal Voluntary Service as 'an exceptional charity that brings the library service to people who can no longer reach their local facility."

Early this month, Callum Bremner, current High Sheriff of Dorset who lives locally, visited staff at Lyme Library and met volunteers from RVS' HLS to see for himself what resources and support are on offer and how he could assist in broadening the readership across the town and beyond.

The Home Library Service is delivered *free of charge*; it is not just for older people, but for anybody who finds getting to the library difficult, including carers, on a long- or short-term basis. ### TRAMPOLINE

Would you believe it is now a full year the in-ground mini trampoline installed into the play area in May 2024 was covered over by the new Parish council. In May 2025 at the annual village meeting I read out the statement below from the installers of play equipment brought about by parish councils being asked to check if their insurance covered the trampolines installed in their play areas this has resulted in the installers of play equipment to write this statement and send it to all insurers to clarify the safety of the in-ground mini trampolines



When this mini trampoline was installed it was indeed insured but August in of 2024 I had a letter from the Parish council stating the insurers had withdrawn the

insurance citing that the insurers would not insure equipment which could be used for "Trampolining and gymnastics"

Furnished with the statement from the installers the parish council who covered over the trampoline on the 3rd August 2024 have as yet not gone back to the original insurers to ask if in the light of this new information if the said trampoline could now be insured.

After a year of being covered over I think it is high time the council revisit their decision from the 3rd August 2024 and get in touch with their insurers forthwith to insure the equipment and uncover and inspect it for damage for the benefit of the children in this village who have been denied use of this for a whole year.

### **Trampoline Insurance**

Just a quick update Chideock Parish Council in conjunction with Dorset Association of Parish & Town Councils have been investigating this issue since July 2024, with the goal of securing appropriate insurance for the trampoline. All parties involved agreed not to bring this into the public domain until the matter is fully resolved.

## Watch out for counterfeit pet medicine

A cat named Smokey nearly lost his life after being treated with a counterfeit flea product bought online. The counterfeit product was a copy of a genuine and widely used 'Frontline' tick and flea treatment. The packaging itself looked legitimate but inside was a toxic insecticide that led to emergency surgery. Smokey survived, but his story is a warning to pet owners everywhere.

The Intellectual Property Office is warning that criminals are increasingly targeting pet owners through online marketplaces. In fact, over 18,000 illegal animal medicines and supplements were intercepted last year alone. A recent survey revealed that 60% of buyers were influenced by ease of access in buying online, and 72% wrongly believed the quality of counterfeit products would match the real thing.

Pet owners, beware: counterfeit pet medicines including flea treatments are being sold online and they could make your pet seriously ill. These products are untested, unregulated, and potentially lethal. One pet owner described a fake treatment that smelled like white spirit. Others have reported spelling errors and poor-quality packaging. Both reports can be clear red flags that something isn't right.

So, in general terms, how can you protect your pet?

**Buy only from trusted sources -** such as licensed vets, pharmacies, or reputable pet retailers.

**Check the packaging -** look for spelling mistakes, poor print quality, or unusual smells.

**Be wary of large price discounts -** if the price seems too good to be true, it probably is.

**Report suspicious products -** contact Trading Standards if you suspect a fake.

# The UK's Ban on Single-Use Vapes

A vape, also called an e-cigarette, is a handheld electronic device that heats a liquid which usually contains nicotine, flavourings, and other chemicals, into a vapour that users inhale. Vapes can be lightweight, colourful and are made in many different flavours. While originally introduced as a smoking cessation tool, vaping has become increasingly popular, especially among young people.

On 1 June 2025 the UK banned the sale of single-use vapes, which are disposable vapes that cannot be refilled or recharged. Designed for short-term use they are typically discarded after just a few days. As a result, they became a major source of waste and pollution.

Before the ban, nearly five million single-use vapes were thrown away in the UK each week. Most ended up in general waste or as litter, posing serious environmental and safety risks. Their lithium-ion batteries can cause fires in waste facilities, while their plastic casings and chemical residues can pollute land and water.

Importantly, the ban also addresses growing concerns about youth vaping. In the UK it is illegal to sell nicotine vaping products to under-18s, or for adults to buy them for under-18s. Despite this, disposable vapes were the most used products amongst underage users, with a quarter of 11 to 15-year-olds reportedly using them. Nicotine is highly addictive, and the long-term health effects of vaping remain unclear. Withdrawal symptoms can include anxiety, headaches, and difficulty concentrating.

Public support for the ban was strong, with nearly 70% of respondents in a 2024 consultation backing the proposal.

Following the ban on disposable, single-use vapes, a vape can now only be sold if it is refillable and rechargeable, so no longer just a single use product.
