Help for Book Readers Accessing Lyme Library





Dorset's Home Library Service (HLS), run by the Royal Voluntary Service (RVS) across Dorset is looking to grow its free service for people who can't get to the library due to health or mobility issues in the Lyme Regis area. The Home Library Service brings books to people who can no longer get to the library for free on a monthly basis and operates from Lyme Library, through a team of RVS volunteers living in the area. The volunteers choose and/or deliver books, after an initial assessment visit to establish the readers' needs and preferences. They share their love of reading with the people they visit and are a friendly face, regularly visiting those whose mobility and social interactions are limited, and they provide a useful check on the safety and well-being of their readers, too.

The Home Library Service is delivered *free of charge*; it is not just for older people, but for anybody who finds getting to the library difficult, including carers, on a long- or short-term basis. Friends of St Giles

Working together with the whole community, the Friends of St Giles, aim to make sure that the fabric of St Giles church is supported financially both now and, in the years to come. Our major project this year, is to contribute to the funds for the new heating system which it is hopefully going to be installed in the autumn.

So far, we have donated £5,000 in June to the fund.

This month, we have raised just over a £1,000 from our annual village barbecue (the final figure is yet to be revealed) - this event was a fabulous day, attended by 100 people and hosted by Sally, Ruth and Robert, Dave and Jane in North Chideock. The heat did not stop people eating copious amounts of food including delicious deserts and salads. Supported by local businesses and farms, it's a real family day out with friends coming together to support the church. This year our new Rector, Fi came along with her husband, Brendon and her daughter, Ellie – and it was lovely to see lots of conversations taking place as people welcomed them into our village and church family.

In September, it is planned to begin a new approach by introducing a Free exchange café at St Giles Church. This is a successful event run by Charmouth church which we are going to emulate. The idea is that you bring along good quality items which you want to get rid of and in return you might pick up something that you might want-there is no exchange of money. If the things you bring do not get taken, then you take them home again. The café will provide cake, savoury scones, coffee and tea for a small charge.

Looking forward to the autumn and harvest, we are already beginning to plan our thoughts about doing things a bit differently, but more of that in the September newsletter. We are a sociable, friendly and lively group, made up of church goers and those who do not - we would welcome anyone to join the group-we can always find something for you to do even when you might think that you have nothing to offer. We meet quarterly with social meals taking place in between. Join us!

Chideock Defibrillator

The evening learning how to carry out CPR and understanding the use of a defibrillator was a great success. Forty people filled the hall to listen to our speaker John Preston from Somerset and Dorset Air Ambulance. He took us through an illustrated talk about the workings of the heart and the difference between a heart attack and a cardiac arrest. He then went on to show us how a defibrillator worked, how to access it by first calling 999 and how its verbal instructions guided you through its use. He had brought four mannikins and having demonstrated CPR to us there was the opportunity for questions and to

get down on to the floor and find out just how much pressure you had to apply to give CPR successfully.

A very informative evening which hopefully will give those attending the knowledge and confidence to act whilst waiting for the emergency services to arrive.

We now have a group of three younger members of the village who will be responsible for the funds raised by the village for the defibrillator. Cliff Allen, Alison Ward and Chris Wood will be working together to open a bank account, liaise with West Dorset Leisure Holidays over the upkeep of our defibrillator and generally look after it on behalf of the village. We are very grateful to them for taking on this task and pleased to hand over to them.
