## **Minutes Matter: Securing the Future of Our Village Defibrillators**

Recently, a close friend of mine—a seemingly healthy man in his 40s—collapsed. He was unconscious and had stopped breathing. Although a defibrillator was on the wall, just feet away, it had not been maintained; the battery was dead. By the time the ambulance arrived, it was too late. He left behind a three-year-old son.

His story could have been different if that device had been ready. Wouldn't it be great if we are never "too late" because of a dead battery, missing pad or a defib too far away.

Many of you will remember the fantastic work led by the Women's Institute to bring a defibrillator to Chideock. It was a vital step for our community, but as I learned, through this personal tragedy, having the equipment is only half the battle.

### **Introducing: The Valley of Winniford Medical Aids Campaign**

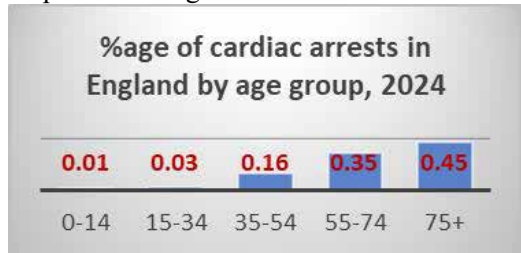
A small volunteer team (Cliff Allen, Alison Ward, Dave Warren, Andrew & Cara Bullmore) has formed **The Valley of Winniford Medical Aids Campaign**. Our mission covers North Chideock, Chideock, and Seatown to, with the support of our community, help facilitate a five-point plan:

1. **Expand Coverage:** Add up to three new defibs (AEDs) to ensure help is within reach. The Resuscitation Council UK states that defibrillation within 3-5 minutes of collapse may increase survival rates by 50-70%.
2. **Rigorous Maintenance:** Ensure, wherever possible, that regular checks are made to keep the AEDs "rescue ready".
3. **Community Awareness:** Promote awareness of the location of defibs and encourage hosts to register them with 'The Circuit' (the national defibrillator network) so they can be found in an emergency, by ambulances and the public. In an English study it was found that 'while 80% of cardiac arrests occurred withing 500m of an AED, they were only used in 10% of cases'.
4. **Free Training:** Arranging training sessions, so residents feel confident to act in an emergency.
5. **Compliance:** Managing insurance and regulatory requirements professionally.

**Where we are now and where we need to be**

We have excellent provision in Seatown, thanks to WDLC and Palmers, partial coverage from the one unit at the shop in the village but none in North Chideock.

Data shows that, for every minute that passes without a shock, the chance of survival drops by 10%.



### Our Campaign:

- **The Cost:** Each new unit costs ~£1,000 (we are exploring leasing), plus ~£500 at least every five years for pads and batteries with installation & insurance on top. Leasing of units, which includes maintenance, can be up to ~£500 a year.
- **The Plan:** We are proposing a grant towards a unit to be hosted by Venn Farm in North Chideock and supporting the funding for the one in the main street Spar. We need to raise funds to complete a valley-wide network. If funds allow, we could co-locate a Trauma Kit for bleed control, in case of farming, traffic, DIY or gardening accidents.

### What's Next?

Over the next several months, we will be exploring the options for securing funding needed to help protect our neighbours, guests and tourists.

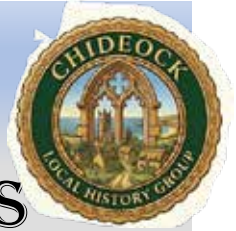

The Clerk will seek to acknowledge receipt of an email within five working days. The Council continues to lobby various individuals, organisations, and bodies regarding the A35 issues experienced by the village. Parish Council Meetings are in-person at the Village Hall at 7pm on the last Tuesday of the month.

The CPC has been involved in the following initiatives over the last month, including -;

1. Meeting with National Highways and Dorsets Environmental Team. The main discussion points related to the traffic arrangements for the Miles Cross roundabout, the completion of the work on the average speed cameras and the development and consultation with the village on a new Air Quality Action plan. Currently National Highways will take over from Connect in the Autumn, and any road improvements will then move to a different provider. It is important that everyone takes note that utility covers are not managed by National Highways, which means if a utility cover breaks/ collapses then an approach has to be made directly to that utility. Dorset council have a list of utilities on their website, which can help to identify who to contact. The CPC have raised directly with National highways current issues in the village, including the escape lane, a partial road collapse on the A35 and a very broken cover up Furches hill.

2. A request for weekly communication on the traffic management plan for Miles Cross has been made directly to the Senior project officer of the project. Copies have been sent to both Cllr Christopher and our MP Ed Morello.

3. Average speed Cameras - lots of people have raised enquiries about this issue. We have been informed that the cameras at the top of Chideock hill are due to be installed at the end of the month, and only then will the system become live. Although National highways have been responsible for their installation, the CPC, understand that once operational, the system is then run

by Dorset Police, although all revenue will go to the government. Average speed cameras operate on the basis that your average speed must demonstrate between two points that you are complying with the speed limit.

4. New late bus service to Lyme Regis - Cllr Anna Dunn was invited on behalf of the CPC to be part of the inaugural bus journey from Bridport to Lyme. It was a delightful journey and hopefully everyone in the village will be able to take advantage of the new service.

5. Overgrown hedges on public footpaths, ROW and Roads. Although it is summer nesting time, it should not prevent landowners from trimming back their hedges, so that pedestrians can safely walk unhindered by branches, overgrown hedges. This is a very specific problem where it occurs on a main road such as the A35. But it is additionally an issue when it prevents people walking along a public footpath or a right of way. Equally, where signs are located in hedgerows, it would be extremely helpful to motorists if they could be supported to drive safely by being able to see the signs. This is a particular problem at the beginning of duck street, and then along mill lane and Seahill lane, the signage provides safety for children and pedestrian protecting them from speeding vehicles and HGVs.

6. The inground jumper is now uncovered after being maintained. The new swing is in place. In the coming months you will see two pieces of old equipment being removed, while thought is given to what next.

7. A successful Annual village meeting took place on the 20th May, at the village hall. All of the annual reports of the various village groups and the parish council, will shortly appear on the parish council website.

8. A sincere welcome to our new parish clerk, Tom Faulkner, whose new email is [clerk@chideockparishcouncil.gov.uk](mailto:clerk@chideockparishcouncil.gov.uk)

9. Last of all, the parish council, would like to put out an appeal to the village. There are currently two vacancies on the parish council, and it would be great if people would consider standing. If you wish to consider it but feel unsure, then please contact the clerk for further information. We would welcome more help - Chideock is as always a busy but interesting place to be part of.
